

## *Erica J. Bailey*

### **Associate Commissioner for Compliance & Enforcement Maryland Insurance Administration**

Erica J. Bailey was appointed as the Associate Commissioner for Compliance & Enforcement with the Maryland Insurance Administration in August 2017. As Associate Commissioner, Ms. Bailey oversees the team responsible for regulatory oversight of domestic and foreign insurance companies, insurance producers, title agents, public adjusters, and bail bondsmen operating in Maryland.

The Compliance and Enforcement Unit's primary mission is to protect consumers from deceptive marketing, unfair claim settlement practices, underwriting and premium rating abuses, and misrepresentation of insurance coverage. The Unit enforces regulatory compliance by companies and insurance producers with applicable state laws and regulations. It also oversees the licensing of insurance producers.

Ms. Bailey joined the Maryland Insurance Administration after 15 years of government practice, including over ten years investigating and prosecuting healthcare fraud with the District of Columbia, Office of the Inspector General, and the Virginia Attorney General's Office.

Ms. Bailey served as the Chief of Civil Investigation for the Virginia Medicaid Fraud Control Unit. In this position, she was responsible for collaborating with federal and state attorneys on investigations and litigation arising under federal and state false claims statutes. Ms. Bailey was also the team leader on numerous multistate investigations and settlements. Ms. Bailey also led the eDiscovery and Litigation support team and worked with the National Association of Medicaid Fraud Control Units to develop national training programs for government attorneys and analysts. Prior to joining the Virginia Attorney General's Office, Ms. Bailey served as an Assistant District Attorney for the Bronx District Attorney's Office in Bronx, New York from 2002 to 2005.

Ms. Bailey received her undergraduate degree from Rutgers University in 1999 and her law degree from the George Washington University Law School in 2002.
